

“What happened to my daughter’s Down syndrome?”

My daughter Maria was born with Down syndrome. As she suffered from mental instability and was unable to steady her body on her own, her growth was slower than that of “normal” children. Our financial difficulties limited the treatments Maria could receive and my heart ached whenever I saw normal children. “I’m so sorry, Maria,” I’d often mutter to her. “I’m so sorry.”

I was led to Peru Manmin Church by my neighbor on September 17, 2007, when Maria was six. I had been poor in spirit on account of Maria’s illness and Senior Pastor Dr. Jaerock Lee’s messages were a source of tremendous strength and comfort.

As I partook in every Sunday services, I have come to possess faith and God the

Healer began to dwell in my heart. I realized that only God the Creator could heal all illnesses and provide answers to a variety of problems in life. I worshipped Him with all my heart and never forgot to pray to Him. Assistance from Revs. Lazarus Lee and David Jang cannot be described with mere words.

As time passed, Maria’s symptoms from Down syndrome improved. As the Senior Pastor prayed from Seoul for Maria from time to time, the prayer that transcends time and space, she could begin standing up on her feet all by herself and speaking coherently. She no longer did anything unpredictable or embarrassing and her concentration also improved. I was so delighted to see her progress and everything about her improvement was a wonder.

On the days she goes to church, Maria could not be happier. She was so adorable when she extended her tiny hand to her father and asked him to go to church with her. As he saw Maria becoming stronger day after day, my husband sometimes came to church with us. Eventually, he joined the church and now volunteers to



ensure the safety of other church members.

I cannot tell you how glad and grateful I was when I saw her praise God through her lips for the first time in 2009, when she was eight years old. From that point on, Maria has never displayed any odd behavior and never been neglected or ignored by others because of Down syndrome. Parents whose children attend special-need schools are envious yet marvel at the way in which my daughter has changed.

As I have experienced God’s power, I have been spreading the gospel with confidence as a cell leader and have so far led about 50 people back to God.

Maria had requested Rev. Lazarus Lee that she would like to offer to God a special performance on January 17, 2010, and she did that day. Who could have imagined such a sight?! Certainly not me! Hallelujah!

“Down syndrome Named after John Langdon Down in 1866, Down syndrome is a congenital disorder resulting from a chromosomal abnormality and is characterized by mental retardation and such physical signs as slanted eyes, flattened facial features, short stature, and is often accompanied by heart disease, mental instability, and abnormality in shapes of internal organs.

I was born in 1984 in a suburb of Kateil, about 300 miles from Kenya’s capital Nairobi. My mother had passed away when I was very small, so my brother and I grew up with our stepmother. The year I turned 13, our father passed away and my brother went to find work in a city. I was left alone and the life at home was a series of agony. Discrimination and persecution made life extremely difficult for me to bear. On top of that, when I turned 17 in 2000, I was stricken with measles and ended up losing sight in both of my eyes.

I went to see many doctors at many different hospitals only to find that there was no cure. As I was now blind, I became completely useless in farming, the household’s only means of living and I was eventually thrown out of the house. With my friend’s help, I went to find my brother in the city but he had turned into an irresponsible drunk. I effectively became a beggar at the markets. During the time I spent as a beggar, I met two pastors who assisted me financially to make ends meet.

January 11, 2010, was the second day of “The Kitale Handkerchief Meeting” (Acts 19:11-12) held by Bishop Dr. Myongho Cheong, Chairman of the United Holiness Church of Jesus Christ, Africa and Senior Pastor at Nairobi Manmin Church. It’s a day I could never forget.

At the urging of and with the assistance from my friend Monica Dudi, I went to the Meeting. Following the sermon message, there was a time of prayer for the sick. Bishop Dr. Cheong placed his hands on my eyes and prayed in earnest. “Father! Show Your daughter here that You are at work at this moment!”

There was a miracle after he had finished the prayer. I began to see light, people, and objects around me. I went straight up to the stage. After having seen how many people had received God’s healing and overcome by joy, I boldly testified to my own healing to people who had only known me as a “blind beggar girl.”

My friends, who had been by my side and seen me suffer for years, became my witnesses and affirmed my healing to all those who doubted. Hallelujah!

family members.

Prior to the Service (following the luncheon prepared by the Welcoming Committee), the delegation paid a visit to the Muan Sweet Water Aquarium located by the entrance to Sanctuary #2 and saw the saltwater fish and freshwater fish living side by side in one tank. The delegation was astonished by what they witnessed and confessed to have seen “a miracle.”

During a meeting that took place

in the Senior Pastor’s Office, Dr. Jaerock Lee spoke with the delegation about recent natural disasters around the world, explained to the diplomats that “Just as we see in the Bible how rain came down and was stopped by Elijah’s prayer, earthquakes, droughts, and the like can be resolved by God when His men and women are asked to intercede,” and planted in their hearts faith in the Almighty God.

The delegation received a warm welcome from the congregation and partook in the Sunday Evening Service, during which it saw performances by the Men’s Mission on occasion of the latter’s Devotional Service and by the Arts Dance Team, and listened to the sermon message. After proclaiming the message,

Full Assurance of Faith

"Let us draw near with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water" (Hebrews 10:22).

There are many ideals and concepts that are not deemed "sinful" or "evil" by this world's measure, but are indeed deemed as such when measured against God's Word. True peace and joy this world cannot provide will make their dwelling in our hearts as much as we have harbored God's Word in our heart and cast off evil, and as our spirits have been renewed. Furthermore, once our hearts have taken after the heart of the holy and perfect God and we have attained a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, each of us will be able to lead a life of prosperity. What steps must we take to attain full assurance of faith?

1. We must recognize evil in our conscience.

In one's life in Christ, a failure to recognize his own evil will slow the growth of his faith. By the same token, when one does not make an effort to cast off that which he has recognized within himself, his spiritual faith cannot grow. Through the attributes of evil with which many of us can identify ourselves and presented in this message, I exhort you to examine how much of evil in your conscience you have come to recognize and to what extent you have cast it off.

The first area concerns all ulterior motives and greed, including greed for material wealth, fame, and authority.

Also included in this category are ego; a desire to be respected and recognized; a heart to insist on only one's opinions and preferences; and a heart to always put oneself and/or his family above others. Many forms of evil are derived from ulterior motives and greed. An individual with such a mindset deceives others, looks only after his own good, and when he is unable to fulfill his greed, that mindset will be displayed in deed in the forms of jealousy, hatred, murder, anger, and quarreling (James 1:14-15). I exhort each of you to attain full assurance faith by accomplishing a clean and pure heart in which there are no emotional attachment and greed (Galatians 5:24).

The second area concerns adultery and fleshly desires. Adultery is a sin God greatly loathes (James 4:4).

God searches a person's heart and is even aware of a fleeting thought or a desire embedded in a glance.

God asks of us more than merely abstaining from committing sin in deed. As Jesus tells us, "[B]ut I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust

for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart" (Matthew 5:28), we must not only abstain from harboring "lust" but must also root out the source of all fleshly desires. Therefore, I urge each of you to consider and treat members of the opposite gender "in all purity" without any fleshly desires (1 Timothy 5:2).

The third area concerns a changing heart.

Prior to entering spirit, many believers say, "Now that I know how futile flesh is, I have resolved to enter spirit." Such resolutions, however, fade out. Some believers set aside time for devoted prayer and fasting but, as their hearts change, they put an end to those resolutions as well. Such changing of heart stems from evil. As evil is stirred, the individual is unable to guard his heart necessary to accomplish goodness.

When an individual changes his heart frequently, he will not take to his heart the Word he hears and be able to use restraint in pursuing the fleshly desires and wants. Thus, he will face many obstacles in accomplishing sanctification. Therefore, I exhort you to make a habit of sticking with even the smallest and the most trivial of resolutions.

2. We have to have our bodies washed with pure water.

Only when we have our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience by God's Word and our bodies washed with pure water, can our faith grow. Here, "water" spiritually signifies God's Word and having "our bodies washed with pure water" refers to a process in which one casts off his evil by living according to God's Word that pierces "the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow" and compels believers to cast off even the most minute of sins.

No one individual can undertake such a process on his own, however. The person must first make an effort and that effort must be accompanied by God's grace and strength and the help from the Holy Spirit. A life in Christ is a continuous process of "having our bodies washed with pure water" until we have attained full assurance of faith.

The extent to which we can accomplish "a sincere heart in full assurance of faith" corresponds directly with the extent to which we wash our hearts with spiritual water. That will ensure our entry into the best heavenly dwelling place, New Jerusalem in which God's throne is seated. I exhort each of you to constantly wash your body with pure water and attain full assurance of faith in gratitude and in gladness.

3. You have to be transformed until you have attained a sincere heart in full assurance of faith.

God wants each of His beloved children to attain a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ. Accomplishing this requires hearing the Word with an earnest heart and fervent prayer to remove elements of evil in one's conscience.

Furthermore, the believer must make an effort to transform himself by keeping the Word close to his heart and living according to it. He must not become disappointed or grow weary when he finds the same attributes emitted from within even when he feels as though he had been casting off evil. I urge each of you to rejoice and be thankful when you find each attribute of evil, and give yourself a positive reminder that you are one step closer to sanctification.

Even as he greatly manifested God's power and communicated in depth and intimately with God, the Apostle Paul confessed that he unceasingly pressed on to reach the level of faith with which God is pleased (Philippians 3:13-14). May your life and place of work abound in testimonies of blessings and may you reach a glorious place in heaven by wholly attaining a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ I pray!

Nation's first Gospel-oriented Nissi Orchestra's 18th Birthday

"No music of this world can compare with the performances we offer to God."



Shortly before 10 o'clock on a Monday morning, members of the Nissi Orchestra gather just outside the Orchestra's practice room. Once they enter the soundproofed room, each member takes his or her seat. Before entering the practice room at 10 o'clock on the dot, they meet about half hour early to devote themselves to prayer. They pray fervently for their performances to be pleasing to God and, more than anything else, to come forth as sanctified vessels whose performances will touch the hearts of listeners. After the prayer, they tune their instruments and begin the practice session under the direction of Deacon Kwanhyung Cho.

In addition to Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays when regular practice sessions are scheduled, when members of the Orchestra gather frequently for various events and for special performances, they set aside time for devoted prayer. Every other month, the Orchestra holds its own service to solidify their hearts to come forth as a group of performers pleasing God.

◆ Established only for the purpose of glorifying God

The Nissi Orchestra is Korea's first gospel-oriented orchestra. Senior Pastor Dr. Jaerock Lee had prayed for years for the formation of professional praise and dance teams as well as an orchestra that would magnify God. As an answer to his prayer, the Nissi Orchestra was established on March 1, 1992, composed entirely of faithful Christians. The name "Nissi" comes from "Jehovahnissi" in Exodus 17:15 (King James Version) and signifies a declaration, "The LORD is My Banner." We find in Psalm 150:3-5, "Praise Him with trumpet sound; Praise Him with harp and lyre. Praise Him with timbrel and dancing; Praise Him with stringed instruments and pipe. Praise Him with loud cymbals; Praise Him with resounding cymbals." God is immensely pleased when His children praise Him wholeheartedly and with many instruments.

Currently in the Nissi Orchestra are 37 full-time members and

27 associate members. Deacon Kwanhyung Cho, who has been the Orchestra's conductor since its foundation, recently observed, "It is not at all easy for a church to have its own orchestra. It has been possibly because in Senior Pastor Dr. Jaerock Lee's great love for God, and his living according to God's will, he has been patient in his love for the Orchestra."

Early on, it took time for Orchestra members to become a cohesive unit. As a gospel-oriented orchestra, one of the important prerequisite was that each member be a baptized Christian. After they have made the Orchestra, new members faced an entirely different environment even though everyone was Christian.

"Everything was unfamiliar at first. The Friday All-night Service and the Sunday services were fine. On the days of practice, the most common topics of conversation were faith and prayer. As we listened to the Word of life and had firsthand experiences of God's power, we found that faith had already been growing in us. Within six months, I was utterly captivated by the Lord. I had forgotten that I prayed back in the first year of high school to become a performer praising God, and He led me onto that path through Nissi."

Deaconess Jiyoung Lee, President of the Nissi Orchestra, smiled as she reminisced about the past. In December 1993, she

has been serving as the Orchestra's President for the last seven years.

Deacon Han-gu Kim, principal trumpeter and leader of the brass section, had majored in instrumental music and graduated from the College of Music at Seoul National University. At the introduction of a college friend, Deacon Kim joined the Brass Ensemble in December 1990 and began his life in Christ. Then in October 2000, he left for the Netherlands, where he studied "Principal Trumpet Course" at Zwolle Conservatorium and Mesian Academy, further studied "Principal Conductor Course" at Rotterdam Conservatorium and Fontys Conservatorium, and returned home after nearly eight years abroad.

"Before I left to study abroad, my life in Christ could be described as having been "flat." When I was abroad, I often thought of the Church and the Senior Pastor. I missed the Church dearly and realized how lightly I had thought of the messages. The eight years abroad was a time during which negative aspects in my life in Christ were resolved. I'm so glad to be back with Nissi."

Throughout its 18-year history, the Nissi Orchestra has been invited to perform at more than 100 events at local, national, and international levels, and for brothers and sisters in Korea and around the world. It has performed at the National Annual Prayer Breakfasts, goodwill concerts at numerous embassies in Korea, at "The Goodwill Korea-Japan Soccer Match for 2002 FIFA World Cup Hosting Project." The Orchestra has also been active within the Christian circles in Korea and contributed a great deal to the development of Christian

in 2006, members have begun voluntarily taking their instruments out to the streets and performing to reach out to the souls. "The Nissi Happy Concert," for example, began with the aim of evangelizing the Guro Digital Valley and for the regional development.

Furthermore, through its releases of praise albums including "Inspirational Praise," "Praising His Grace," "Holy, Holy, Holy," and "Christmas Festival" at home and around the world, Nissi is spearheading the spread of God's love and grace, and seeks to bring back countless souls around the world back to God with the production and distribution of higher-quality praise music.

Conductor Deacon Kwanhyung Cho recently expressed his aspirations for the Orchestra. "Nissi has become the Christian community's premier orchestra," Deacon Cho observed. "It is the only civil orchestra in Korea to have a 7,100-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility to accommodate the entire orchestra, a choir's practice room, and private practice rooms. Nissi will become a 120-member orchestra and the best in the world."
